

## BONNEVILLE SCHOOL-WIDE RULES & POLICIES

**Be safe \* Be Respectful \* Be Responsible \* Be Courteous**

<b>Rule:</b>	<b>Description:</b>	<b>Consequences:</b>
<b>RESPECT ADULTS</b>	Students need to listen to and obey adults. Breaking this rule includes talking back, rolling their eyes or making another such expression, ignoring a request, etc.	Students can miss recesses and spend them in the classroom or LRR - at teacher's discretion.
<b>USE APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE</b>	Inappropriate language includes swearing, crudeness, reference to violence, graphic descriptions, offensive things, etc.	Students can miss recesses and spend them in the classroom or LRR - at teacher's discretion.
<b>KEEP HATS AND HOODS PUT AWAY</b>	This means any type of hat is not to be worn any time in the school except on "theme" days or Halloween. Hats must be removed and put in backpack (even winter hats). They will be taken away by any adult who sees the student in the halls or lunchroom. They can be worn outside.	Hoods need to be taken off and hats must be put in backpack.  Hats taken by adults in the halls or lunchroom will be held at the office.
<b>KEEP PHONES PUT AWAY</b>	Phones are sometimes needed by students to get ahold of parents after school but should remain in student backpacks on silent mode and not used during school hours at all.	These will be taken away and parents have to come get them from the front office.
<b>KEEP SKATEBOARDS AT HOME</b>	Students should not have skateboards on school grounds.	These will be taken away and parents will have to come get them from the front office.
<b>BE RESPECTFUL AND SAFE IN THE HALLS</b>	Students should WALK in the halls. Students should be QUIET in the halls. Scooters must be left locked at the bike racks. Students should ENTER their classroom in the mornings through their designated OUTSIDE door to check in with their teachers. Students should EXIT through their designated OUTSIDE doors at the end of the day to avoid disrupting classes (2:15) and to avoid confusion and safety issues that occur when many students are traversing the halls at once. (3:30) Students who are at school early may stay inside near the main doors or go to the library until the bell rings, then go to line up at their designated outside door.	Teachers will explain the dangers of running in the halls. Teachers will explain being respectful of the learning going on in classrooms by being quiet in the halls. Any student who is running or being noisy will be asked to go back and walk. Any student in the halls (other than near the front doors or on their way to the library or office) will be asked to go around to the designated door to wait, until the bell.
<b>WEAR MODEST, SAFE CLOTHING</b>	NO SHORT-SHORTS- general guideline is fingertip length or longer NO REVEALING TOPS - spaghetti straps, midriff showing, unusually tight NO HEELIES OR FLIP FLOPS	Classroom teachers are in charge of enforcing this, as they know the situation of each student. Other adults will not give consequences. Students can get a Bonneville shirt from Camie or call home for change of clothes or shoes.
<b>KEEP NATURAL HAIR COLOR</b>	This will only be addressed if it becomes a distraction.	Classroom teachers use their discretion. Parents notified by classroom teacher.
<b>BE SAFE AT RECESS</b>	NO FIGHTING- hitting, kicking, slapping, pushing NO SNOWBALLS- throwing snow or ice NO TACKLE FOOTBALL FOLLOW OTHER RECESS SAFETY RULES	Students will be sent to Mr. Brooks. Consequences may include LRR time, in school or out of school suspension. If a lot of problems have arisen for a particular grade, football and/or soccer may be banned for that grade.
<b>KEEP GUM AT HOME</b>	No gum chewing at school. Individual teachers may make an exception to this rule if the gum is monitored in the classroom.	Students need to spit out gum they are chewing and teachers may throw away any unchewed gum that is found.
